From the 405 Freeway

- 1) Exit at Westwood/Wilshire east.
- 2) Proceed east on Wilshire for approximately 2 miles.
- 3) Turn left on Westwood Blvd.
- 4) Turn right on Le Conte.
- 5) Turn left on Hilgard.
- 6) Turn left on Westholme Avenue which is an entrance onto the campus.
- 7) The parking kiosk is on your right. If you have parking arranged for you, a pass will be waiting at the kiosk. If not, you will need to pay for parking (\$7) at the kiosk and then ask for directions to Parking Structure 2 (P2). (It is just south of the kiosk.)
- 8) Hershey Hall is just south of Parking Structure 2. It will take approximately 5 to 10 minutes to park and walk to Hershey Hall.
- 9) The event is located on the 1st floor as you enter Hershey Hall.
- 10) Follow the signs to room 1648.
